

WILMSLOW WELLS FOR AFRICA GARDENS DAY, 30th June 2018, 10.30am – 4.30pm

1. 🚰 **Steven and Jill Kimber - Well House, Dean Row Road, Wilmslow, SK9 2BU** See how our 3 acre garden is progressing with new woodland paths, a host of wild orchids in the meadow, blooming herbaceous borders and wild flower areas crammed with native species. The garden opens for the NGS. **Parking at The Unicorn using spaces in rear car park.**
2. **Gerry Lemon and Angela Ferguson - Bollin House, Hollies Lane, Wilmslow, SK9 2BW** There are two parts to this garden, formal and a wild flower meadow. The garden contains richly planted, herbaceous borders, an orchard, wild flower garden and vegetable plot. In the meadow are cornfield annuals and perennial wild flowers; easily accessible with mown paths. This garden opens for the NGS. **Tea & homemade cakes served here.**
3. 🚰 **Peter and Tress Attwell and Audrey Holley - 31 Adlington Road, Wilmslow, SK9 2BJ** A one acre garden comprising herbaceous borders and a pond around the lawn with a rose and clematis covered pergola leading to a vegetable plot with a greenhouse and small orchard. **Parking in Wilmslow Park. Note that Wilmslow Park is private but on this occasion the residents have given permission for them to park in Overhill Road or Fawns Keep. Please park considerately.**
4. 🚰 **Peter Woollam - Hough Garden, Hough Lane, Alderley Edge, SK9 7JE** A half acre organic ornamental kitchen garden with over 200 edible varieties. Many wood and willow structures made by Peter. This garden has been featured in national garden magazines.
5. **Amanda and Ray Wigglesworth - Woodbrook Cottage, Woodbrook Road, Alderley Edge, SK9 7DE** Set into the hillside and bounded by historic brick walls, this intriguing garden contains an array of interesting woodland plants as well as a number of tropical species, interspersed by a variety of artwork. There are delightful views of the garden from the shade of a loggia running across the stone flagged terrace. **Cream teas here. Limited parking on site for those with less mobility - otherwise please park on Trafford Road.**
6. **Chorley Hall Lane Allotments - Chorley Hall Lane, Alderley Edge - Fenton Simpson** and his fellow allotmenters welcome you to their gardening haven where they grow a wide range of fruit, vegetables and flowers. They even press the juice from their apples on site. Recognised with an 2017 RHS Award as “Thriving”. **Parking available on site (access from Chorley Hall Lane adjacent to the railway bridge) with an alternative pedestrian entrance from the park.**
7. **Colin and Carole Summersgill - 7 Heyes Lane, Alderley Edge, SK9 7LA** A small town garden skilfully terraced with contemporary features for outdoor living, enhanced with a beautifully coordinated modern planting scheme. **Park at Festival Hall**
8. **John and Gwennie Wallace - 9 Heyes Lane, Alderley Edge, SK9 7LA** Retaining the original 1923 design concept, this is an organic “garden of curiosities”. The compact sloping site contains numerous trees and shrubs, many self-seeded and clipped by John to a variety of shapes, interspersed with intriguing artefacts reflecting his many interests. **Park at Festival Hall.**
9. 🚰 **Meriel and John Currie - 23 Green Villa Park, Wilmslow, SK9 6EJ** An interesting 1/3rd acre garden divided by a stream with a bog garden border, a goldfish pond, herbaceous, hosta and vegetable beds. **Plants for sale here.**
10. 🚰 **Anne and Doug Macdonald - 14 Mayfield Grove, off New St, off Moor Lane, Wilmslow SK9 6BU** A delightful one third acre garden with 3 wildlife ponds, an island bed, raised vegetable beds, herbaceous borders, mature trees and shrubs. Children must be supervised. **Tea & homemade cakes.**
11. **Caroline Melliar-Smith - 68 South Oak Lane, Wilmslow, SK9 6AT** Attractive small hedged cottage garden shows the owner's passion for plants. Year round colour, scent and interest. Enjoy tranquillity and peace on this plant-packed journey. This garden opens for the NGS.
12. 🚰 **Fiona and Gordon MacDonald - 18 Summerfield Place, Wilmslow, SK9 1NE** A secluded corner garden, partially redesigned to enable a shared living space between the house and garden. This features a raised flower bed planted with perennials to provide summer colour as well as the clever use of paving and fencing materials to provide interest and continuity with the original garden area.
13. 🚰 **David and Carys Cash - 61 Hawthorn Lane, Wilmslow, SK9 5DQ** The three levels of the garden are united by a flowing lawn extending above a stone patio. This is flanked by well stocked herbaceous borders with mature trees (including a tulip tree), a fernery, a hosta collection, raised vegetable beds and a greenhouse. **Tea & homemade cakes. Plants for sale here.**
14. **Eileen and Malcolm MacAulay - Dial House, 62 Carrwood Road, Wilmslow, SK9 5DN** Described as “the best and probably the only modernist domestic garden in the county” in the Historic Gardens of England (Cheshire). **Bacon rolls until 1.30 and cream teas all day.**
15. **Michael Thorley and Bill McQueen - 21 Vale Road, Wilmslow, SK9 5QA** This popular garden with its beautiful summer flowering borders, fern bed and pond continues to be refreshed. The woodland walkway has recently been transformed so that it now extends down to the stream with steps and retaining walls having been renovated and extensive new evergreen planting carried out.
16. 🚰 **Angela Barclay assisted by Phil Sutton - White Pines, Greaves Road, Wilmslow, SK9 5NJ** Recently re-modelled, this delightful one acre English country garden has a nature trail which passes through lawns edged by mature shrubs before crossing a bridge over the lake alongside a waterfall which leads into a woodland area. **The lake water is deep - children must be supervised! Limited parking available for disabled on site, otherwise park in the adjacent field (entrance opposite Black Donkey Cottage), lent by Mr Oates.**
17. **Roger and Christine Goddard - The Spinney, 35a Bollin Hill, Wilmslow, SK9 4AN** Redesigned in 2014, this south facing garden has a circular lawn as its central feature. This is approached via gently stepped paths flanked by well planted borders with water features providing visual and aural interest. Beyond, walkways meander through the wooded backdrop with plantings of camellia and rhododendron species. **Tea and homemade cakes served here.**
18. 🚰 **Belinda Geddes and David Pritchard - Parkfield, Woodend, Styal, SK9 4HF** This large mature garden blends traditional with modern design influences and includes formal areas and courtyards, two ponds and a range of specimen trees and shrubs. Curving paths lead through herbaceous planting to a gazebo via a circular stone terrace which contains glacial boulders and a sculpture formed from old railway sleepers. **Parking: follow drive past the house into farmyard and then into field on left.**
19. **Barry and Melanie Davy - Brooke Cottage, Church Road, Handforth, SK9 3LT** A plantaholics paradise, this garden was recently partially remodelled. It is divided into three distinct zones: the woodland area which has over 30 types of fern and shade loving plants; the herbaceous borders which also feature ornamental grasses; and the container garden which contains many hosta varieties. This garden opens for the NGS and was recently featured in the RHS “The Garden” magazine.
