WILMSLOW WELLS FOR AFRICA GARDENS DAY, 28th JUNE 2025, 10.30am – 4.30pm

1.Janette and Paul Hopkin - Longcroft, Oak Road, Mottram St Andrew, SK10 4RA (west side of Oak Road 500m south of village centre) One and a half acres of garden to explore or just sit and enjoy the views. This romantic country garden has formal and informal areas with roses, shrubs, a small copse, herbaceous borders – one of which has just been replanted, wild flower areas with ponds and a vegetable garden. Hard work for wheelchairs but no steps. **Park on the road opposite the house.**

2. Peter Woollam - Hough Garden, Hough Lane, Alderley Edge, SK9 7JE A half-acre organic ornamental kitchen garden with over 200 edible varieties. Many wood and willow structures made by Peter. This garden has been featured in national garden magazines.

3. Peter and Pam Higham - Four Winds, Hough Lane, Alderley Edge, SK9 7JE ³/₄ acre traditional English country garden with herbaceous borders overlooking farmland and the Edge with Lyme Park in the distance. Disabled parking on the drive.

4. Amanda and Ray Wigglesworth - Woodbrook Cottage, Woodbrook Road, Alderley Edge, SK9 7DE Set into the hillside, this intriguing garden contains an array of interesting woodland plants and tropical species, interspersed by artwork. A loggia gives delightful views across the garden. Cream teas served. Park on Trafford Road – limited parking on site only for the less mobile.

5. Jo and David Mottershead - Cheriton, 34 Congleton Road, Alderley Edge, SK9 7AB SW-facing with long views, this 1-acre garden is split into cottage, oriental and white birch areas. Mature, including herbaceous plants and young specimen trees. Significant and exciting new changes made in all gardens. Tea and cakes served here.

6. Beech Close Community Allotments, Alderley Edge, SK9 7LY From dereliction in 2021 to an RHS Award in 2024, there are 22 allotments, all run on organic principles with sustainability as the focus. Working alongside nature, there is a community orchard, ponds, nest boxes and the site is home to hedgehogs, foxes, bats and birds. The rewilding project has a mini woodland donated by the Woodland Trust. Refreshments served in the community hub but no toilets available. Park on surrounding roads.

7. Jenny and Dick Stain - 2, Prospect Cottages, Prospect Lane, Alderley Edge, SK9 7ST A country garden with roses, herbaceous borders plus a mix of fruit and vegetable beds, hens and a productive greenhouse. Walk to the fields with a wildlife pond, sheep, lambs, bees and fruit trees. Tea and cakes. Park in field off Prospect Lane as signposted, NOT in the lane.

8. Jenny and Jim Morris - Kennerley House, Foden Lane, Mobberley, WA16 7BA A three-acre mature garden including natural ponds, a stream, woodland, herbaceous borders, a fruit and vegetable garden, herb garden in kitchen sinks, a collection of planted chimney pots, an old working water pump and a few weeds! Outside loo. Parking on the drive.

9. Meriel and John Currie - 23 Green Villa Park, Wilmslow, SK9 6EJ An interesting 1/3rd acre garden divided by a stream with a bog garden border, a goldfish pond, herbaceous, rose, hosta and vegetable beds.

10. Anne and Doug Macdonald - 14 Mayfield Grove, off New St, off Moor Lane, Wilmslow SK9 6BU A delightful one third acre garden with 4 wildlife ponds, an island bed, 3 raised beds, herbaceous borders, mature trees and shrubs. Children must be supervised. Tea and homemade cakes. Cul-de-sac location, parking limited.

11. Richard and Bethan Weston - 36 The Circuit, Wilmslow, SK9 6DB This garden is home to The Wilmslow and Lindow Light Railway, a 16mm narrow-guage, live steam model railway. Steam trains will be running throughout the day and refreshments including ice lollies for the small and big kids alike will be available.

12. Ann and Nick Vaughan - 9 Strawberry Lane, Wilmslow SK9 6AQ A mature garden with mixed herbaceous borders, 2 rose arches, fruit trees, raised salad and vegetable beds, a greenhouse and a small wildlife pond. The planting is being developed to encourage pollinators and so that there is something in flower each month of the year. **Plants for Sale**.

13. Maxine Drabble - 1A Broad Walk, Wilmslow, SK9 5PJ A delightful garden in an awkwardly shaped plot originally designed for shade. The back garden is in a contemporary urban style while the front is more traditional. Planted with climbing roses, clematis and herbaceous perennials. **Bacon rolls and refreshments all day. Craft beer from 1pm.**

14. Carys and David Cash - 61 Hawthorn Lane, Wilmslow, SK9 5DQ The three levels of this garden are united by a flowing lawn flanked by well stocked herbaceous borders, a tulip tree, a fernery and a modern greenhouse with several tomato and cucumber varieties. Top level has been redeveloped around an extended lawn. Tea and homemade cakes. Plants for sale.

15. Noreen and Kevin O'Sullivan - 32, Hawthorn Lane, Wilmslow, SK9 5DG A mature, suburban, north-facing garden sloping down to woodland. A terraced patio leads to lawns surrounded by trees, shrubs, roses and perennials. The middle lawn is allowed to grow into a wild meadow in summer. No pesticides are used and this nature friendly garden has something for pollinators throughout the year.

16. Ruth and Simon Lees - 18 Hawthorn Grove (2 stone gateposts mark entrance), Wilmslow, SK9 5DE An interesting almost organic 1³/₄ acre garden on a hillside bordering the Bollin. Herbaceous raised bed at front, raised vegetable beds behind; hens, bees, greenhouse, pond and woodland. Soft drinks or a glass of prosecco available here. Park in designated spaces on Hawthorn Lane or Hawthorn Grove, the Parish Hall or at Waitrose.

17. Richard and Andrea Styles - Bollindale, 18A Hawthorn Grove, Wilmslow, SK9 5DE A sloping garden above the River Bollin with far reaching views across the Carrs. Undulating and flowing lawns surround a natural spring. Much new and young planting. Long herbaceous borders, small parterre and a pergola covered in roses and clematis.

18. Angela Ferguson and Gerry Lemon - Bollin House, Hollies Lane, Wilmslow, SK9 2BW A garden with great views, a wild flower meadow and beautiful, wide, perennial filled borders as well as a formal area with parterres and water feature. **Hot and cold drinks only available**.
