Two landmarks achieved in the same month as our one hundredth newsletter goes out at the same time as we commit to our four hundredth project! Many thanks to all who worked hard in different ways to make both the Spring Superday and Gardens Day so successful. Thanks also to those who supported these events. Hopefully a good time was enjoyed in the process. Together, they raised a magnificent £21,656!

We also benefit when other organisations arrange fundraising events and decide to donate the proceeds to Wilmslow Wells. A recent example is St Cross Church in Knutsford who selected part of Project 388 (3 Borehole pump repairs in Malawi) for their lent project. Their initial target was £600 but in the end they achieved an amazing £1,905 which was almost enough to fund the entire project. A fantastic effort!

### **ELEVEN PROJECTS COMPLETED including:**



**377 Zambia, Nanolo & Nanjucha,** construction of new water points plus hygiene and sanitation training to support two communities previously vulnerable to disease from unsafe drinking water. With Village Water, funding of £6,830. Water points named in memory of Alan and Pat Parfett.

392 Malawi, Chiringa Area. Construction of hand dug latrines for 100 simple individual households in rural areas not connected to a community sewerage sturdy These are but system. screened units which help prevent diseases such as cholera. Previously families had to resort to using open fields for their toileting needs with all the environmental hazards, health risks and lack of privacy that brings. With Aid Africa, funding of £2,668.



#### 15 NEW PROJECTS SINCE THE LAST NEWSLETTER:

- **388 Malawi Bongwe and Luwani villages.** Repairs to broken borehole pumps in 2 villages which left 810 households in severe distress. With Aid Africa, funding of £1530 donated by St Cross Church, Knutsford through their Lent Appeal.
- **389 Malawi Lolo village.** Repair to broken borehole pump which left other pumps in Lolo overwhelmed with queues and congestion. With Aid Africa, funding of £744 also part provided by St Cross.
- **390 Tanzania Kamachumu in Muleba-Kagera Region.** Spring protection provided for about 3,000 people. With Tanzania Development Trust, funding of £1,620.
- **391 Zambia, Bangweulu Wetlands.** Two shallow wells and 100 latrine slabs provided for community within important ecology area. With Afrinspire, funding of £4,052.
- **392 Malawi Chiringa Area.** Provision of 100 latrines across 10 villages. With Aid Africa, funding of £2,668.
- **393 Uganda Rutunguru near Ntungamo.** Protection for a spring delivering 20,000 litres of clean water per day on hill above Little Shepherd School. With HUGS, funding of £2,500.
- **394 Uganda Pingire, Kadungulu (2 No.) and Bugondo.** Four shallow wells serving a total of 354 households who currently have a 3 3.5 km daily walk for water. With Teso Development Trust, funding of £6,000.
- **395 Burkino Faso Zondomo Area.** Refurbishment of 5 shallow wells serving approximately 1750 people. With Transform Burkina, funding of £5,150.
- **396 Ghana Kumasi.** Deep borehole for Brightlingsea Academy (provided in Kumasi in 2017) following depletion of hand-dug well. With Porridge & Pens, funding of £4070.
- **397 Uganda Kayonza and Butogota, Kanungu Dustrict.** 5 spring water wells serving 39,190 people in an area which currently has no access to safe clean water. With JEGMI, funding of £7,325
- **398 Uganda Olony Village, Gulu City.** Drainable toilet block at Mama Elisabeth Nursery and Primary School (see project 372). With Bujagali Trust, funding of £7,931.
- **399 Malawi Villages to be identified.** 100 latrines for individual households hand-dug 3m deep pits surrounded by bamboo screening for privacy (similar to project 392). With Aid Africa, funding of £2784.
- **400 Malawi** Block of 2 toilets (1 for disabled girls), 2 changing rooms, water storage at Moani Primary School. With Chifundo UK and Chanasa Malawi, funding of £5,000.
- **401 Uganda Jinja area (east and west banks of the Nile).** Rehabilitation of 2 boreholes with full WASH package. With Busoga Trust, funding of £5,000.
- **402 Zambia Lunga Island in Lake Bangweulu.** Construction of 6 shallow wells and 2 repairs. With Afrinspire, funding of £3,750.
